dated 11th March 1922.

Clear the Line.

Gandhi was arrested and lodged in jail to-night, without any disturbance or incident. All quiet so far.

Addressed to Viceroy and repeated to Secretary of State for India.

Telegram from Viceroy, Home Department to Secretary of State  
for India, dated 5th March 1922.

Clear the Line.

Reference my telegram of the 1st instant. ~~Following telegram~~  
has been received from Government of Bombay. Begins.

Governor of Bombay in Council decided unanimously to proceed with prosecution of Gandhi, under Section 124 A, Indian Penal Code, in respect of the following four articles published in "Young India":-

1. "Disaffection a ~~xx~~ virtue" dated 15th June 1921.
2. "Tampering with loyalty" dated 29th September 1921.
3. "A puzzle and its solution" dated 15th Dec. 1921, and
4. "Shaking masses" dated 23rd February 1922.

It was decided also to proceed simultaneously against J. C. Beiker, Printer of "Young India", on the same charges.

Arrests will be effected, probably at Bardoli, on the evening of Wednesday, 7th March.
