HOUSING POLICY

INTERIM REPORT OF THE CABINET COLLITTEE.

(Reference - Uabinet 719)

The committee/considered in detail the lowerendum circul. ted to the cobinet by the Limister of sealth (C.P.94) and other relevant papers and reached the following conclusions which they desire to submit to the Utbinet for approval:-

ASSISTABLE TO PRISE.

C.1.94 rage 4, 5 (b)

The Committee decided to recommend to FRIVATE ENTER- the Cabinet to grant a subsidy to private enterprise on the lines set forth in the memorandum of the limistor of Rotlth, vaz., a subsidy not exceeding : :100 per house of approved type and lag out up to a limit of 100,000 houses to be completed within the next 12 months.

UO-OF LHATIOL OF BULLDERS.

U.F. 94, tuge 3, 2 (a)

The Committee concur in the proposel forth by the limister of ealth providing for operation of the agreements reached with the building trade on the understanding that the agreement with the house builders under section 12 (6) of the cousing act will be operated so as to recure a good type of house and not to conflict with the subsidy crrangement.

CO-OPERATION OF THE BOARD OF ACRICULT-LRM & FISHER-ILS.

U.r. 122

The Committee concur in the proposal of the President of the Courd of Agriculture and Fisheries that, subject to the provisions of the Housing acts and after opportunity has been afforded to county councils to help, the Board of Agriculture shall be called upon to assist the inistry of Health in cases of defaulting rural authorities.

LULURY BUILD-IUG & DIMOL ITION OF HABIT.BLE HOUSES

0.2.94 Page 5 (0)

- The Committee agreed that the . inistry of Health should be equipped with powers -
 - (a) to prohibit during a given term the construction of buildings of a nonessential character in cases where the construction of such buildings was restricting the building of houses.

(b) to prohibit the demolition or the putting out of use of existing habitable houses.

(The Obancellor of the inchequer dissented from (a))

FOWER TO SUPPLEMENT LUTHORITIES! SUITES.

The committee decided that in the case of a Local Authority which, although not technically in default, was at the same time not active, the inister of ealth should be granted authority (in pursuance of lection 15 of the 1919 ..et) to prescribe that works undertaken by the inistry to supplement the ousing cheme of such a Local ... thority should form a part for financial purposes of the local scheme; this authority, however, to be confined to cases of the conversion of existing houses and of emergency accomodation.

- Page 4 (5) (a) 6. A Sub-Committee examined the question of housing finance in consultation with the Covernor of the Lank of England and Ir ... H. H. Goschen, and reached the following conclusions:-
 - (1) That the Chancellor of the Echequer should write to .r oschen asking his Committee to examine carefully the suggestion which had been made that money for housing schemes should be rassed locally by the issue of small bonds which would at a later date be accepted in payment for houses, should the holder of the bonds so desire, and which the working classec, in particular, should be encouraged to buy by the initiation of vigogrous campaigns and by other methods in support of them; the Jommittee to present an Interim eport on this subject at the earliest possible date.
 - (2) That the Minister of lealth and the ecretary for jootland should examine carefully the cases of all those authorities whose schemes were said to be held up on account of their inability to raise the necessary money; that the list of such Authorities sould be out down to an absolute minimum, containing only those of whom Ir addison and .r . unro were satisfied that they had done everything in their power to raise the money and still had failed to do so; that in each case an estimate should be made of the immediate and prospective liability of the Treasury if it were decided to grant these authorities State aid in order to proceed with their schemes; and that this list should then be considered as absolutely final and should be sub. mitted to the chancellor of the mohequer for consideration.

On this the chairman desires to make the

reservation that in the event of authorities being unable to raise the necessary money as suggested in 6 (1) he would be compelled to approach the Chancellor of the tichequer with a supplementary list.
